RE:Welcome back

Welcome to the new school year! We have absolutely loved opening our doors again, to new and returning students alike, for what has been an action-packed first 2 weeks back, celebrating and setting the foundations to continue to build on last year and Oakbank Schools' best ever results at GCSE. We had a wonderful visit from Baroness Barran on the 16th September who was amazed by just how safe, calm and happy the environment is and the consistency in our classrooms.

We were lucky to have 1 day with just our Year 7 and 11 students on Friday 4th, which seems a long time ago. All year groups, especially the Year 7's have made a fantastic start to the year. It was a pleasure to spend some time getting to know each of our new Year 7s, see the two year groups side by side, modelling our values of hard work and kindness, and getting stuck into inductions and lessons in the first week. We know that for Year 7s in particular it's a big change from primary schools, so it's important to us to take the time to teach them what our routines look like, how to behave and how to manage the school day - they have done such a great job. We can't wait to continue the team ethos for our Year 7's at our fully funded 3 day residential at Ufton court next week.

Since Monday, excitingly, students have also been learning how to complete their self-quizzing homeworks across all years. As you may be aware, this year all students from Years 7 to 11 will quiz themselves each evening on ten pieces of core knowledge, things they really have to know to be successful in lessons. All students were taught how to do this effectively, using look, cover, write, check, and we have been really impressed by the response from the students so far. One student said to me this week 'I am actually looking forward to homework so it will help me in lessons'. This is exactly what we're aiming for and we're so thankful for the support from home at the homework evening and can't wait to get started on Monday.

In teaching and learning this week and throughout our INSET days all our fantastic staff at Oakbank School have been receiving training on our core routines and a key aspiration to get 100% of students thinking about the right thing 100% of the time. This will mean lessons are tightly structured around students having the chance to routinely recall knowledge, concentrate on new concepts, and apply that learning to challenging tasks. This has culminated in some fantastic lessons over the last two weeks.

A big thank you to everyone at home who has supported in ensuring students were September ready, with perfect uniforms and all their equipment. Our continued thanks for supporting students to get back into the routine of attending school every single day, attendance being the single biggest predictor of student academic progress. Your efforts at home are greatly appreciated and have been key in raising our overall attendance for all years by over 10% compared to this stage last year with over 250 students with 100% attendance.. We know that when students attend Oakbank School they succeed and our year 11 results have shown us just how great this school is and will be, with an average grade across all subjects of nearly a 6 for students who had 90% attendance last year. This shows that our core routines and teaching and learning is having the desired effect and will continue to improve.

Lastly the past two weeks have seen students vote on the brand new House system that we will be introducing. This is an opportunity to engage and make the school even more fun and exciting and you can find out more about this in the newsletter and for correspondence.

We are delighted to report that, at the time of writing, **just over 80% of Oakbank students have achieved 100% attendance** this academic year thus far.

House System

A house system is a powerful way to build community within a school, fostering a deeper sense of belonging that research suggests can improve attendance and engagement for students. For many pupils, their house provides identity, pride, and shared purpose. It encourages friendships across year groups, helping to reduce feelings of isolation and strengthening the wider school community. This week saw us launch the house system in assembly which we are introducing this academic year.

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Houses also create opportunities for healthy competition and recognition both in and beyond the classroom. Success in areas such as attendance, positive behaviour, and inter-house competitions allows every student to shine in different ways and to contribute to something bigger than themselves. All students and staff were informed of the options and have had the opportunity to vote for what they would like the houses, logos and colours to be. The choices, students and staff could vote on were, UK Peaks, Mountainous Animals and Famous Mountaineers.

Voting has taken place, and votes have been collated with the winning house by over 100 votes as Mountainous Animals. Therefore we are excited to announce our new houses are:

Unifrog – Supporting Your Future

We are using **Unifrog** again this year to help all students think about their future and make informed choices at every stage of their Oakbank journey.

Students should log into Unifrog every week and complete the tasks and interactions that have been set for them. The platform will support Year 7 and 8 students in discovering their interests, skills and passions, help Year 9 with GCSE choices, support Year 10 with Work Experience placements, and help our older students explore and make informed post-16 choices.

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Ms Korporowicz has already shared a number of Unifrog interactions, including information about upcoming college and sixth-form open evenings, apprenticeships and webinars. Students should check these regularly so they don't miss opportunities that could be important for their next steps.

Students have also received a **Future Skills Questionnaire** via their school email. This short questionnaire helps us understand students' current knowledge, skills and confidence around careers and their future. The results will help us make sure that the careers support and opportunities we provide are right for our students. **All students should check their school email and complete the questionnaire as soon as possible.**
